

THE GOOD NEWS

The State of Wisconsin finds itself in an unprecedented position as the State's predicted budget surplus has reached \$6.6 billion.

THE REALITY

Six of the last eight years, revenue limits for public schools have remained unchanged. There is a growing gap between rising costs and school budgets, resulting in less sustainable services for students, especially with one-time Federal ESSER funding set to expire.



BUDGET PRIORITIES

1. Predictable, Sustainable, Spendable Inflationary-Responsive Revenue Limit Increases.

- At the end of 2022, budgets for public schools were approximately 20% lower than in 2011 due to the difference between inflation and revenue limit increases.
- Inflation measured 4.7% in 2021 and 8.01% in 2022 as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI). During that same period, no increase was provided to the revenue limit for Wisconsin school districts.

REQUEST: Provide predictable, sustainable, spendable, inflationary-responsive revenue limit increases for public schools. This will provide public school districts with a reasonable long-term strategy to address regular cost increases.

2. Provide an Increase to the Special Education Reimbursement Rate.

- In 2021-2022, Whitefish Bay School District transferred over \$3 million from its general education fund to support additional costs associated with providing special education for students.
- Increasing the special education reimbursement rate for public schools will help all students.

REQUEST: Increase the Special Education Reimbursement Rate for public schools. Increasing state aid for special education will help all students in our schools.

3. Provide Mental Health Funding.

- Community resources and student access to mental health services are not keeping up with the urgent level of need. Schools are asked to address the resulting gaps.
- According to Student Mental Health (2019), "One in five students faces a mental health issue. Over 80 percent of incidents go untreated."

REQUEST: Increase the amount of sustainable mental health funding in order to meet the increasing demands of providing mental health support for all students.

Inaction may result in:

- An impact on class sizes and course offerings
- An impact on school districts' ability to provide competitive compensation to attract and retain high quality employees
- An impact on school districts' ability to maintain facilities

An impact on school districts' ability to identify, address, and support student mental health challenges
