About the District

The School District of Colfax serves 685 students in one school building, an elementary school (4K-grade 5), a middle school (grades 6-8) and a high school (grades 9-12). The district takes pride in providing a diverse array of opportunities for all students to enhance their learning experience and to ensure continuous student success. The district is also known for its longevity of staff staying in the district.

REFERENDUM INFORMATION

The last referendum was passed in 2016 for \$7.2 million for facility updates and an additional elementary classroom wing. There are no current referendums.

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DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

- One building for all grade levels allows the district to have modern academic and athletic facilities, including a top-of-the-line camera security system.
- On-site mental health counseling is available to district students.
- Little Vikes Junior Kindergarten Daycare Program is available to families whose children are enrolled in the half-day junior kindergarten program. This allows children to stay on campus for the full school day.
- The district owns multiple forest properties throughout the school district boundaries.
- Connections are made with the community to celebrate its veterans with an annual program.
- A fitness center is accessible to the community.
- A comprehensive curriculum is offered that includes Advanced Placement, dual credit courses and distance learning.
- Graduating seniors have numerous scholarship opportunities available through the generosity of the local community.
- Extracurricular opportunities include Chamber Choir, FCCLA (Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America), Fishing Club, Forensics, FBLA, FFA, Jazz and Pep Bands, NHS, Peer Mentoring, School Play (spring permformance), Science Olympiad Club, Student Council and Yearbook.
- Athletic programs include girls and boys basketball, cross country, dance, football, girls and boys golf, gymnastics, softball, track, volleyball and wrestling.
- Summer school programs are available: summer school, summer swimming, teambuilding/orientation days.
